Bylaws/Policy and Procedures Fall Report 2019

This Bylaw Chair with the help of Marsha Benedict CMA-A (AAMA) and MaryLou Allison CMA-C (AAMA) reached out to all chapter Presidents and all chapter bylaws are now revised for 2018-2019 and posted on the FSMA website under each Chapter with the following:

ARTICLE IV: MEMBERSHIP

Section 5: STUDENT MEMBER

E. STUDENT- A Student member:

- 1. Shall be enrolled in a medical assisting program.
- 2. May choose a two-year student membership term or a one-year student membership term.
 - a. After a two-year student membership term, the member is then eligible only for either associate membership or active membership (if the member meets the active membership requirements).
 - b. After a one-year student membership term, the member is eligible for a second year of student membership as long as the member renews during the member's one-year student membership term. After the second-year of student membership, the member is then eligible only for either associate membership or active membership (if the member meets the active membership requirements).
 - c. No member is eligible for more than a total of two consecutive years of student membership.

At the 66th Annual General Assembly on April 26, 2019, Article IX rewording was approved by the General Assembly to increase participation in FSMA activities Bylaws updated as follows:

Article IX - Liaison Board

Section 1. The Liaison board:

- A. Encourage physicians, NP/PA, MGMA and other professional medical groups to support the medical assistant's active involvement in the FSMA and their educational programs.
- B. Seek alliance with Florida Medical Professional Associations, for support the credentialing of medical assistants.

Also, at the 66th Annual General Assemble on April 26, 2019, Article XVII: Judicial Council which would be added to the current FSMA Bylaws and Standing Rules was voted NOT to adopt and to be brought back for clarification of rational at the next executive board meeting in November 2019.

The proposed added wording as follows:

Proposed Wording: 196 Article XVII: 197 Judicial Council

- A. The Judicial Council shall consist of three Past President of the FSMA whose membership is active.
 - 1. Annually, with approval of the Executive Council, the President shall appoint the most immediate Past President to serve for a term of three years. This member serves as chair.
 - 2. No member shall serve more than two terms, but a member appointed to serve an unexpired term shall not be regarded as having served a term unless serving three or more years.
- B. The judicial power of FSMA shall be vested in the Judicial Council, whose decisions shall be final.
- C. The Council shall have jurisdiction in all questions involving:
 - 1. membership as provided in the Bylaws
 - 2. controversies arising in the interpretation of these Bylaws
 - 3. the code of Ethics of the FSMA
- D. The Judicial Council shall:
 - 1. meet or consult upon the call of the Chair; consultation by mail, phone or electronic means shall be permitted among members of the Council provided the rights of the appellant are not prejudiced.
 - 2. submit an annual report to the General Assembly

Rationale: Incorporate a body of experienced past Presidents as a resource for the executive board in reviewing matters or controversies arising related in the interpretation among the executive board members as provided in the Bylaws and Code of Ethics of the FSMA. Proposed change in bylaw regarding Vice President succeeding to President. **Current Wording:** ARTICLE VI - EXECUTIVE COUNCIL AND THEIR QUALIFICATIONS Section 5. The Vice President shall automatically succeed to the office of President at the end of the term as Vice President. Suggested wording: Section 5. The Vice President may automatically succeed to the office of President at the end of the term as Vice President. Or Remove the statement entirely? Rationale: Executive Office positions are difficult to fill and many members do not want to commit to 2 years service in advance. The FSMA Bylaws and Standing Rules have been updated and sent to be reposted to the FSMA website. This officer appreciates the opportunity to serve the Florida Society of Medical Assistants for 2019-2020...

22 (AAMA), and the FA Davis Student Award. Awards of Distinction included the Golden 23

Apple Award, Leadership and Mentoring, and Medical Assistant of the Year. The CMA

(AAMA) Employer of the Year Award went to Mercy Health Physicians in Lima. This is 25

the first year for this award. This delegate is happy to report that the Florida Society won 26

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This was the third year that the conference offered a free app through CrowdCompass.

As a reminder from last years report, the CMA (AAMA) recertification policy change to 39 take effect January 1, 2020 – To better ensure current competence and knowledge, the 40 certifying board of AAMA has made the following change in policy regarding the time 41 limit for recertifying the CMA (AAMA) credential by continuing education: Effective 42 1/1/2020, an individual whose credential has been expired for more than 3 months 43 forfeits the right to reactivate the credential by continuing education and must sit for the 44 CMA (AAMA) Certification/Recertification Exam. Three attempts are allowed to sit for 45 and pass the exam. If the candidate does not pass the exam on the third attempt, the 46 candidate is no longer eligible for the exam or to recertify the CMA (AAMA) credential. 47 Payment of a \$50.00 reactivation fee plus the current exam fee is required. 48

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The HOD delegate/alternate orientation took place Saturday morning. This session is a requirement for all Florida delegation. The ABC's of Parliamentary Procedure is handed out at this session as reminder of how to conduct oneself in the House. Voting continues to be handled electronically and has been so for 6 years now. Each year a demonstration is given and practiced to make sure all delegation understands the electronic voting process. This is obviously most helpful for first time delegates and alternates as well as a good reminder for those who have voted before. For credential check in, the delegates and alternates are required to have their AAMA membership card. This mandate went into effect six years ago as well.

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An assessment based certificate in Pediatrics will be coming soon to the AAMA e-Learning Center.

- 2. 1. Documentation of the qualifications of the nominee and written consent to serve have been submitted to the Speaker of the House 30 calendar days prior to the last business day before the opening session of the HOD. It was

previously noon central time of the last business day prior to the opening session of the HOD.

A special presentation by AAMA CEO Donald Balasa occurred during the morning session of the HOD. The Certifying Board of AAMA has approved the launch of a three year pilot program which expands the education pathway for medical assistants to take the CMA (AAMA) certification exam. To be eligible for the CMA (AAMA) Certification exam under the eligibility pilot program, candidates must have graduated from a postsecondary medical assisting program meeting program and institutional criteria established by the Certifying Board. The candidate must also furnish proof of having met the graduate criteria established by the CB. The graduate criteria include demonstration of knowledge and psychomotor ability in certain tasks as evidenced by an official transcript, course descriptions and syllabi, and an attestation letter from the program director or instructor verifying a candidate's successful completion didactic and psychomotor requirements. For more information go to www.aama-ntl.org/cma-aama-exam/eligibility-pilot-program.

An open forum for questions and comments about the pilot program occurred later in the day after the reference committee hearings. There were definitely mixed feelings about the pilot program by those in attendance at the open forum. The educators of ABHES and CAAHEP accredited programs are concerned with other institutions bringing down the high standards that we currently have with the CMA (AAMA).

Education topics attended by this delegate on Saturday were: After You Call- Know the Protocol, HPV Misconceptions, Rheumatoid Arthritis, and Update on How to Avoid Identity Theft. An ample amount of clinical, general, and administrative topics were offered during the conference.
